He was not pushing it with his hands, he was blowing air with his mouth into a tube to get the wheelchair to move. He is paralyzed from the neck all the way down. As he rolled in, he was making jokes about how most people are paralyzed from the inside and he is paralyzed from the outside and, he then told his amazing story.

Afterwards, I went and bought a book he wrote. Someone working for him handed me the book, they asked if I wanted him to sign it, and who to make it out to. I said yes, to my wife. He had a pen in his mouth and I opened the page for him to sign. He signed the page and wrote my wife's name and then put a happy face next to it. After reading his book "Never Give Up" where he talks about the accident and more and more problems after that. All my problems became smaller and smaller and I was even ashamed to call them problems. Ron although quadriplegic from the age 18, he is independent and successful. He moved out of his parents house – determined to live independently, got married, earned a Bachelors Degree and then a Masters degree afterwards – writing with his mouth. He has created exceptional paintings with his mouth. Even with so many problems, surgeries, rejections, where one would have very little hope of success – he just kept on going. He has achieved so much, more that most people can achieve. No matter how big you think your problems are, firstly, you will never want to swap them with anyone's, and secondly, there's always someone out there with more problems than you.
